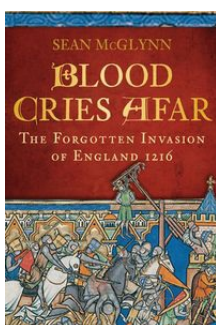


BLOOD CRIES AFAR: THE FORGOTTEN INVASION OF ENGLAND 1216
